And of course, she loved to sing ballads from the 1940s and 50s and knew all the lyrics to her favorite Peruvian "valses".

Emma was the loving mother of Juan C. Bellido, of North Easton, Massachusetts. She able to spend part of her later years with him and his wife, Linda (Beaudette) Bellido, and from their very infancy, was the doting "Abuelita" to Zachary and Noah.
